They learned how many days a fertile egg needs to be in an incubator, the temperature, the humidity levels and what happens to eggs that have amoralities. At April's meeting they created a homemade incubator using a plastic tote with a lid, light, and light bulb. They had to follow the simple directions to install the light in the tote. They tested the light bulb to make sure it worked. They put shavings on the bottom and placed a sponge in a dish for humidity and temperature gage in it.


The Hartwick 4-H Theatre Guild - "Peter Pan"

DAIRY DISCOVERY '19 focus was "Dairy Herd Health and Management". Youth observed and participated in technical skill training related to such topics as Biosecurity, Linear Type Evaluation, Managing Risk in Fresh cows, Reproduction, "Good Sneakers", Animal Welfare, and DHI records

Comments from the participants:

Gavin Fetterman—At Cornell Dairy Discovery I learned a lot. I learned how to do a vet check, A.I. Cows, and how to trim feet. This was a great opportunity to help me figure out what I would like to do in college.

Sean Kersmanc—I enjoyed the learning experience. Some of the highlights: sizes of needles, how to trim hooves, practicing AI, learning about herd health using temperature and heart rate. I found out more about Cornell and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS).

Gavin Bonczkowski—I had a great time at Dairy Discovery. We learned about hoof trimming, genetics, reproduction, animal health and record keeping. I learned a lot and met many new people. It was a lot of fun being at Cornell University and learning more about areas in the dairy industry. I would highly recommend this program to anyone interested in the dairy industry.

Pullorum Testing information:

- ◆ BIRDS AT MUST BE LEAST 4 MONTHS (16 WKS) OLD
- ◆ Chickens, turkeys, guinea fowl, peacocks, pheasants & quail eligible. Pigeons and waterfowl are exempt from testing.
- ◆ Birds obtained from an NPIP certified hatchery/flock (or from a feed store), may exhibit with a copy of the NPIP certificate or receipt showing the NPIP Information. These expire in one year.

The recommended 840 identification tag for cattle and pigs will be a requirement in **2020**. **BEAT the rush...** Tag your animals now. The 4-H office has a supply of 840 and tags available for your use.

Note: All last year's official IDs: 21H tags, 21 metal tags, grandfathered registration tags placed in cattle before 3/11/2015, and 840 tags are all official and acceptable.

NYS Junior Dairy Leaders & Beginning Dairy Leader Program Prepares young people for successful careers in the dairy industry

The PRO-DAIRY Youth Program provides opportunities for young people to learn about careers in the dairy industry through educational programming as well as hands on opportunities and helps them to develop their interest, enthusiasm, knowledge and leadership skills necessary for creating a successful career in the dairy industry.

NYS Beginning DAIRY LEADER Program — This program is for high school students entering at least their sophomore year, but not graduated, who have potential interest in dairy industry or agricultural careers. High school participants will have the chance to explore post-secondary agricultural education and career opportunities in a networking environment through interaction with faculty and students, college planning and personal development. Program Cost: \$100

NYS Junior DAIRY LEADER Program — This one-year program explores careers in the dairy industry along with hands-on experiential learning for a select group of youth ranging from 16-19 years old. 
