

This year NINE Otsego County 4-H members spent three fun-filled days connecting with careers, Cornell and NEW friends! The 4-H Career Explorations Conference is made up of two program tracks – University U (those entering 8th & 9th grade) and Focus for Teens (those entering 10th – 12th grade). Teens choose the grade appropriate program they are most interested in exploring.

- University U: Participants are introduced to Cornell's campus through campus tours and participating in six different on campus departmental workshops.
- Focus for Teens: A more intense program where participants spend three days with a specific Department.

The Farmers' Museum Junior Livestock Show

The annual Junior Livestock Show will be held July 7 - 9.

Stop by to see 4-H members and their 4-H animal projects.

The show is the second largest youth competition in the state and the only one of its kind sponsored by the Farmers' Museum.

A tradition (72 years!) in central New York, the event features the area's best livestock and 4-H exhibitors from the nine-county region. The event tests the skills of participants (ages eight to eighteen) who present animals (dairy cows, beef, swine, goats, and sheep) that they own, care for and have prepared for competition.

The event is held at the Iroquois Farm, 1527 County Hwy 33, Cooperstown.

4-H Agri-Business Career (ABC) Conference Thursday, October 17, 9 a.m. -Friday, October 18 at 4:30 p.m.

The New York State 4-H Agribusiness Career Conference is held at SUNY Cobleskill and local agri-businesses. This **career exploration conference** is open to all youth ages 14 and over who wish to become more aware of opportunities with agriculture and the academic requirements for professional positions available in the various agri-business. It will feature mini-tours to farms and operations in the Cobleskill area as well as seminars, guest speakers and guided tours of the SUNY Cobleskill agriculture facilities.

Participants and chaperones will be staying at Super 8 in Cobleskill. The participation fee of \$95 per youth will include all overnight accommodations and meals. Scholarships will be available.

840 Tag update from Dr. Scrafford, DVM, 3.28.19

The recommended 840 identification tag for cattle and pigs will be a requirement in **2020**. **BEAT the rush...**Tag your animals now. The 4-H office has a supply of 840 and tags available for your use.

Note: All last year's official IDs: 21H tags, 21 metal tags, grandfathered registration tags placed in cattle before 3/11/2015, and 840 tags are all official and acceptable.
