Cornell Cooperative Extension, in partnership with Cobleskill-Richmondville Central School, Schoharie Central School, and Middleburgh Central School, provides afterschool programs that serve over 110 students in grades K-6. The program serves students at Schoharie Elementary (grades K-6), Middleburgh Elementary (K-6) and Ryder and Radez schools (K-6).

The afterschool program offers 4-H projects, indoor/outdoor recreation, arts, crafts, games, homework helper, and a nutritious snack. In addition, cultural exposure, computer literacy, conflict resolution, and service learning enrich and instill life-long skills. 4-H Youth Development Programs use experiential, research-based educational opportunities to help youth develop independence, a sense of belonging, generosity, and mastery.
