M DAIRY QUIZ BOWL



4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl is a "quiz bowl" competition where all questions deal with dairy topics. Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner.

The contest is organized on a double elimination basis with winning teams advancing into further rounds until a champion team emerges.

Competition in the 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl encourages a 4-H member to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness and self-confidence.

Senior Team-youth must be at least 14 years old as of January 1 and not pass 19 by January 1



Animal Crackers All Creatures Great & Small Virtual Workshops May 2021

Suggested age range is ages 9-12, however, all 4-H youth 9 and up are welcome to attend.

<u>Cost: \$50</u> for an individual registration, which covers all eight (8) sessions.

Scholarships are available! Contact your local 4-H extension office to register.

Registration closes **April 1**, **2021** for planning purposes.

May 4, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Dive into Equine Rehab" SUNY Morrisville Equine Rehabilitation Center virtual tour. Learn what it is like to nurse a horse back to health in a state-of-the-art facility. From acupuncture, to heat therapy, to water therapy learn about what it takes to get these athletes back to the best of their ability.

May 6, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Fiber Sheep" Learn the steps that take fiber from "in the grease" to a finished spun or felted product, select fibers for finished products, how to prepare wool for your projects, and feel the difference in a variety of sheep fibers.

May 11, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Poultry Anatomy" Overview of basic poultry anatomy, focusing or digestion, reproduction, and parts of the egg.

May 13, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Constructing Reproduction" Participants will review and identify the basic parts of the cow's reproductive tract and then make a model of and demonstrate the fertilization process in cattle.

May 18, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Basic Pet First Aid" Lessons on making pet first aid kits, how to take vital signs, recognizing shock and other ER's, and basic bandaging techniques.

May 20, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Yikes! There's a Goat in my Tub" Explore the properties of goat milk soap and compare how a sample of goat milk soap measures up to your soap at home. Youth will receive a laminated sheet of the goat breeds, instructions on how to make a halter or macrame collar for your goat, AND some goat cheese and meat recipes.

May 25, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Pigs Inside and Out" Explore pig anatomy, body parts as related to cuts of meat. Learn all about what makes a pig tick!

May 27, 2021 - 6-7 pm: "Basic Rabbit & Cavy Care" Tour a rabbitry and visit with cavies! Learn about what it takes to care for rabbits and cavies - housing, water, nutritional needs and more! Receive worksheets, samples of rabbit fur/wool and feed samples for both rabbits and cavies in your take home kit!

Tips for Public Speaking

- ✓ Practice
- ✓ Know the Subject
- ✓ Know your Audience
- ✓ Use Humor
- ✓ Make eye contact
- ✓ Use visual aids
- ✓ Speak clearly and in a friendly voice
- ✓ Take breaths between units of thought
- ✓ Use good posture and movements
- ✓ Talk at a normal speed but avoid being monotone

TIPS FOR RECORDING YOUR 4-H PUBLIC PRESENTATION



Presenting to a camera is different from presenting to a live audience. Here are some tips for recording your public presentation on a smartphone.

HAVE EVERYTHINGS YOU'LL NEED

Have your presentation materials ready. Any note cards, props or visual aids you'll need should be within reach.

FIND A GOOD LOCATION

Choose a quiet place to give your presentation. You don't want to be distracted or interrupted!

POSITION YOUR PHONE

Consider how you will keep your phone steady. This can be as simple as stacking books on a table and propping your phone against them, or using a camera tripod, if you have one. Try to keep the camera lens a little below eye level; you should be looking slightly downward towards the lens.

SETTING UP YOUR PHONE

In your phone's settings, switch to Airplane Mode. This will prevent you from being disturbed by interruptions or calls during recording. Turn your phone sideways in Landscape (horizontal) mode, not Portrait (vertical) mode. Have the camera's screen facing towards you. You'll be using the front-facing camera. (Have someone help you position yourself.)

CLEAN THE CAMERA LENS

Phones pickup all kinds of smudges during daily use. You can use a soft cloth to wipe it off. (Microfiber cloths, used for cleaning glasses, are great for this!)

CONFIGURE YOUR PHONE TO RECORD

Make sure you have enough space to record. You shouldn't need more then a gigabyte (GB) for your presentation. Your phone may allow you to record at a very high resolution, but a smaller file will be easier to upload later. Check your camera's settings and use the lowest resolution (720p on iPhone, 1280 x 720 on Android) Set your phone's camera app to video mode and switch to the front facing camera (aka Selfie mode)

FRAME YOUR SHOT AND SET SOME LIGHTING

Make sure your phone is horizontal and level. Position yourself in the shot, slightly off from the center. (This assumes your phone's camera is positioned just above the screen when the phone is in portrait mode.) Use ceiling lights, floor or table lamps to make sure you're well lit. Move lights around to see what looks best when you're in position. Alternatively, you can record with a window providing light from the side.

RECORD A TEST

Hit record and make a test video. Play it back to make sure you can be heard. (It's easier to make adjustments now, then finding out after you presentation!) Rehearse to make sure you've allowed enough space that you won't go in & out of frame.

ACTION! TIME TO RECORD


Look at the phone's lens-not the screen. This allows you to keep eye contact with you viewers.

WHEN YOU START

Hit Record, get into you position, and set yourself (count to three in your head), and start

WHEN YOU FINISH

You wont' be able to take questions as you would with an in-person presentation, so hold your position, look into the phone's lens, say something in indicate you're finished (ex. Thanks for listening to my presentation on ___) count to three again in your head and then click the Record button off.
