The 4-H Afterschool program is happily back in Schoharie Elementary School. Children have recently completed a Halloween bulletin board with associated crafts and are currently piloting a Lego Challenge project. In the first challenge, children built Lego homes and furniture for the Lego people. In the upcoming weeks, children will continue to create seasonal artwork and bulletin board displays. Hands-on STEM activities will also be introduced including making slime and playdough, sink-and-float-experiments, and kitchen chemistry. Stay tuned for the results in the next issue!




