



Visitors can watch northern fur seals at play while they soak in sweeping views of Boston Harbor in the New Balance Foundation Marine Mammal Center.

Reach out and gently touch cownose rays, Atlantic rays, and epaulette sharks as they swim through The Trust Family Foundation Shark and Ray Touch Tank, then dive into the Science of Sharks at our exhibit featuring shark species from around the world. Meet three different species of penguins and pet a sea star, meet a lobster, or cradle a hermit crab at the Edge of the Sea's tidepool touch tank. Wind your way along the four-story Giant Ocean Tank and be mesmerized by the 200,000-gallon Caribbean coral reef exhibit teeming with more than 1,000 marine animals. From the Atlantic harbor seal exhibit to the Olympic Coast Exhibit to the Yawkey Coral Reef Center, the Aquarium has something to entertain visitors of all ages.

Kathryn Santoro- My 4-H career began when I was 7, and I showed my chickens with Jacob every year at the fair and Eastern NY State Poultry Association's Fall show in September up until this point in time. Every year being friendly competition for grand champion and reserve grand champion showman. I showed my chickens at the State Fair and placed second in Showmanship. Eleven years of showing birds and I still love it.

When I was ten, I tired my first goat show at the Farmers' Museum Jr Livestock Show in Cooperstown, and decided to lease a goat kid from the Kelley's for the fair. Her name was Muffin. I remember placing well in my class for 4-H as a novice.

I began showing horses 5 years ago in 2014, which has taught me more about myself than anything. Finally this year, my last year in 4-H, I had the opportunity to show my German Shepherd in the dog show. My 4-H career has been more than showing, it has been growing as a person and helping others.

My final year meant more to me than any other year in the past. I have become so involved and attached to my 4-H club Happy Hoofsters. I will greatly miss all of the girls and boys. Shelby Coons created a drill team that I am captain of and that team is my pride and joy. Watching the girls in my group grow as riders and look up to me not only as a role model, but an older sister figure has been amazing.

My final horse show was taxing on me emotionally, mentally and physically but I didn't quit. Quitting at that point would have been a let down to myself, my trainer and most of all my girls.

So take it from me, although you may not be into horses or chickens, there will always be the younger kids who look up to you and want to be like you.

Showing never gets easier, every year brings a different challenge, so persevere. Don't give up. Pass on your knowledge. Take the minute or two to answer a question a youngster has or help them before a show, because those moments are the ones that count the most. Those are the moments that will keep 4-H alive and thriving with new kids wanting to join every year.


