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Schoharie County 4-H Meeting, Activity & Event COVID-19 Safety Guidelines



Given the recent changes in guidelines for gatherings, we are passing along guidance in relation to in-person 4-H Meetings/activities/events

- Limit total numbers to maximum of 10
- If your meeting attendants/club member's school district is on only remote learning then you cannot be hosting an in-person meeting
- Please remember that refreshments need to be served in such a way that everyone is eating and drinking while seated & <u>physically distanced</u>.
- Pre-packaged food and drinks only
- Masks must be on at all times
- Reminder—no meetings in private homes
