#### The 4-H Emblem

The emblem is a four leaf clover with an "H" in each leaf. The letters in the emblem stand for HEAD, HEART, HANDS, and HEALTH which are the foundation for all 4-H programs.

HEART... Being concerned with the welfare of others, accepting responsibilities of citizenship, determining values and attitudes by which to live, learning how to work with others




