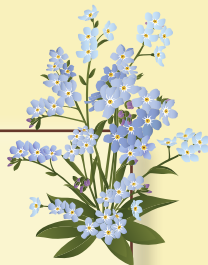

Who are the Master Gardeners?

The Master Gardener Program is a corps of trained volunteers who work in partnership with their county Cooperative Extension to expand educational outreach throughout the community by providing home gardeners with research-based information. Master Gardeners assist with gardening projects in their communities, teach classes and workshops, plant and maintain demonstration gardens, provide information and soil pH testing at events, and address gardening questions.
