<u>Pollination:</u> the process of moving pollen from one flower to another of the same species, which produces fertile seeds.

Most flowering plants are pollinated by and depend on bees, butterflies, beetles, and other insects and animals. Growing native plants adds beauty and important habitats for wildlife, especially pollinators.

Pollinators have evolved with their native plants. Most pollinators feed on specific plant species, and non-native plants may not provide enough nectar or pollen. Biologists fear several butterfly and bee species have disappeared from parts of their native range due to habitat loss, disease, pollution, and pesticide poisoning.

We can do our part to support pollinators by creating pollinator friendly gardens and protecting their natural wildlife habitat.
