Applicant Guidelines


- 2022 graduating High School Seniors who will continue their education to prepare for a career in some way connected to the diverse agricultural industry. This includes advancing their education through college or pursuing advanced training in the skilled trades.
- Live or work on a farm or be involved with agriculture via any avenue.
- Family Farm Bureau membership or Student Farm Bureau membership is required. <u>Students can join as a Student</u> member by visiting www.nyfb.org/membership.

Process and Procedure

- Applications & information is available at the NYFB website, www.nyfb.org or more specifically https://www.nyfb.org/programs/promotion-education/scholarship
- Students are required to complete an application which is on the Reviewr on-line platform. The direct application link is: https://my.reviewr.com/site/NYFB Ag Youth Scholarship22
- After creating an account in Reviewr, the student will log in and begin the application. The student can stop, restart, and edit their application any time before the submission is due by logging into their Reviewr account.
- Applications must be competed and submitted by 5 p.m. on March 1, 2022.
- A District level competition will be held. Scoring will determine the County winners as well as the District winner. If applications do not meet the criteria to be a district winner, no district award will be given. The judging event may necessitate a personal interview and essay presentation or may be based solely upon the application and attachments. The judging will take place prior to April 20, 2022. Each District Winner will receive \$250 plus a memento of their selection.
- State winner selection will be made from District Winners, based solely on the submitted applications; there will be no personal interviews.

General Rules for both contests:

By submitting an entry or entries to this contest, you are giving Cornell Cooperative Extension's YNOE Program Work Team permission to use your image or story on our Facebook, website, blogs, and in any public displays we can arrange for the entries.

Each participant is limited to one entry. You may complete several and select your best one to enter. Each participant may enter one story and one art piece.

You must sign and date your entry (cursive is NOT required).

We encourage you to use New York native mammal species but will accept any WILD species, birds, amphibians, reptiles, insects, mollusks, etc... (no domestic birds).

There will be three age categories: Cloverbud Youth ages 5-7, Youth 8-12, and Youth 13-19.

The judging will be done by a group of volunteers (youth and adults) selected by Cornell Cooperative Extension.

Art Specific Guidelines:

The work can be no larger than 8.5" x 11".

This must be an original piece started and completed within the contest entry dates and deadline dates. You may use any style you choose (e.g., watercolor, pen & ink, pencil, oils, acrylic, etc.) that can be rendered on the specified paper dimensions.

Specific Story Guidelines:

Your story must be original and describe an encounter or observation you had where a mammal or mammals played a central role.

500-word limit

Prizes:

Cloverbud (5-7) youth will each receive a Participant ribbon and no overall winner will be selected. Youth 8-12 or 13-19, the top recipient will receive a \$10 gift to the 4-H Mall.

2022 Horse Quiz Bowl

District Event - March 19 - Chenango County "Educational Competition Event"

Individuals or teams of four compete in a quiz bowl format against other counties on general horse knowledge. Topics include colors breeds, care and feeding, parts of the horse and tack, show rules, diseases, conformation, unsoundness, shoeing, breeding, etc. Coaches run weekly practice from December through March. Open to 4-H members ages 9 to 19.

Teams consist of no less than four and not more than six members.

Seniors - at least 14-years of age but not yet 19-years by January 1 of the current year

Juniors - youth ages at least 9 and less than 14-years old as of January 1 of the current year.

Novice - youth ages at least 9 and less than 14-years old as of January 1 of the current year and never participated in any previous Horse Quiz Bowl contest.

DAIRY QUIZ BOWL



2022 District Event - March 19 - Chenango County

4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl is a "quiz bowl" competition where all questions deal with dairy topics. Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner.

The contest is organized on a double elimination basis with winning teams advancing into further rounds until a champion team emerges.

Competition in the 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl encourages a 4-H member to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness and self-confidence.

Beginner Division - youth ages 8 to 10 years as of January 1st. It is not appropriate for Cloverbud members to participate in the contest. Beginner Level is replacing Novice Level.

Junior Team - youth ages at least 9 and less than 14-years old as of January 1.

Senior Team - youth must be at least 14-years old as of January 1 and not pass 19 by January 1 of current year.
