The 4-H Earn-An-Animal program allows for Otsego County youth ages 8-18(as of January 1) to earn funding towards a project animal to raise and show as their own. This program quires dedication from the vouth member and support from their guardians. Youth accepted to the program will not only learn how to care for their animal, they will experience the process of researching, selecting and purchasing an animal. Through the 4-H Earn-An-Animal Project, 4-H youth will further develop their planning, time management, organization, and record keeping skills.



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March Dog Madness

March Dog Madness is an annual conference for adult and teenage 4-H volunteer leaders. Workshops engaged participants in science-based information training. Current animal health, animal behavior, industry trends and youth development issues are addressed. Past guest presenters included stakeholders, extension professionals, community, and youth experts. This program is designed to help community leaders understand and practice principles that they could take back and share with 4-H members at the local level. Adult and teen leaders gained networking skills, exchanged ideas and had an opportunity to work together in a university setting. This event is open to all interested staff, adult and teen 4-H leaders were invited to attend this one day information packed program. Dog project leaders engaged in local community training programs were strongly encouraged to attend. Presentations from a variety of experienced professionals may have included: Cooperative Extension Staff, County Volunteers, Cornell University Veterinarians, community collaborators, etc. This Saturday workshop is held every March at the CALS Department of Animal Science on the Cornell Campus (507 Tower Rd., Frank B. BUILDING CONNECTIONS FOR SUCCESS: February 19th -6:30-8 pm


