In December they learned the breed standards of goats, and practiced a goat bowl. They made goat ornaments for the Christmas tree.



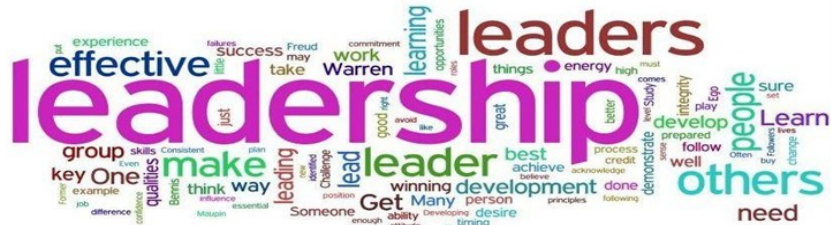
Ewes & Friends met in December. They elected officers, had a cookie exchange, and did some sledding!

4-H DAIRY EVENTS & OPPORTUNITIES

4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl—Held in March. Opportunity for 4-H youth to demonstrate their knowledge of dairy related subject matter in a competitive setting.

Beginner Division—youth ages 10 and under as of January 1.

Junior Team—youth ages at least 9 and less than 14 years old as of January 1.

Senior Team—youth must be at least 14 years old as of January 1 and not pass 19 by January 1 of current year.

4-H Dairy Challenge—An Educational activity for 4-H youth to test their dairy management knowledge and skills, evaluate top quality animals, and receive experience in evaluation and decision making to further their success in the dairy industry. Contest activities consist of youth rotating through different stations within their division. Youth will be tested on general knowledge in the following designated areas: dairy judging, farm and food safety, nutrition and feeds, housing and facilities, dairy products, health and diseases, reproduction, farm business management, records.

4-H Dairy Discovery—Held in March—The annual Dairy Discovery program provides New York youth with fun, hands-on science oriented learning experience on dairy production and management topics which feature the unique facilities, industry professionals and staff of Cornell. This state wide event is for youth ages 14-19.

4-H Dairy Judging & Tours—These educational event helps you to develop a skill for selecting animals based on body conformation and breed characteristics. 4-H Dairy Judging Tours are planned throughout the year.

NYS Junior Dairy Leader—the Junior Dairy Leader program is intended to reach youth between the ages of 16-19 who have an interest in exploring careers in the dairy industry through hands-on experiential learning. The program presents youth with a realistic view of the dairy industry as a viable and profitable progressive business sector, while also building personal and professional skills. The program consists of a series of workshops that focus on multiple facets of the dairy industry, personal development and technical skills. Opportunities included:

- Representing New York at the National 4-H Dairy Conference
- Interaction with Dairy Producers and Agribusiness Professionals
- Resume Development
- On-Farm Production Management Experiences
- Leadership Development and Team Building
- Dairy Farm and Production Facility Tours in the Northeast and Wisconsin
- Technical Skills Seminars in Herd Health, Calf Care, Dairy Nutrition, and Artificial Insemination

Horse Quiz Bowl is an exciting opportunity for 4-H youth with a passion for equine to showcase their horse knowledge in a competitive, jeopardy-like contest.

This contest involves a series of questions that are asked either of a specific individual or a team. Participants use a buzzer system to 'buzz' in first and answer questions. These questions might be in the form of a regular question, toss-up, or bonus depending on the half of play. There are a variety of subject areas covered: general equine terms, the horse industry, feeding and care, and anatomy.

2026 PILOT PROGRAM

SAT APRIL 25TH @ 2:00 PM AT CORNELL

New York State 4-H members who are 14 years of age or older (as of January 1) are invited to participate in the first-ever NYS 4-H Livestock Bowl Competition.

To qualify to participate in the event, youth must complete an online written test by March 15. Up to the top 36 youth will be invited to participate in the contest. The top four youth at this contest will represent New York State at the National Livestock Bowl Competition in Kentucky in November 2026.

More information will be coming in the next few months. The New York State 4-H Livestock Contest will follow the National Contest rules. For rules and sample questions, visit <https://youthlivestockcontests.org/>. Additional information will be shared with County Educators, and a virtual Zoom meeting will be held in early February.

The program

The 4-H Earn-An-Animal program allows for Otsego County youth ages 8-18 (as of January 1) to earn funding towards a project animal to raise and show as their own. This program requires dedication from the youth member and support from their guardians. Youth accepted to the program will not only learn how to care for their animal, they will experience the process of researching, selecting and purchasing an animal. Through the 4-H Earn-An-Animal Project, 4-H youth will further develop their planning, time management, organization, and record keeping skills.
